| WHEREAS, numerous County residents have expressed their concerns to the Board of County Commissioners ("Board") regarding the federal government's and the World Health Organization's attempts to impose public health mandates and limit the healthcare freedoms and rights of individuals; and | | |
| WHEREAS, the Board wishes to address the concerns of County residents by codifying certain protections of individual freedom of choice as it pertains to healthcare, and to guarantee the God-given right and obligation for individuals to preserve their bodily integrity in a manner consistent with the dictates of their conscience; | | |
| NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF COUNTY,: | | |
| SECTION ONE: Title | | |
| This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the " County Health Freedom Ordinance". | | |
| SECTION TWO: Purpose and Intent | | |
| The purpose of this Ordinance is to safeguard the healthcare rights and freedoms of County residents. | | |
| SECTION THREE: Applicability. | | |

| SECTION FOUR: COVID-19 vaccine documentation prohibited. | | |
| A business entity within County may not require patrons or customers to provide any documentation certifying COVID-19 vaccination or post-infection recovery to gain access to, entry upon, or service from the business operations in County. This subsection does not otherwise restrict businesses from instituting screening protocols consistent with authoritative or controlling government-issued guidance to protect public health. (B) County will not require anyone to provide any documentation certifying COVID-19 vaccination or post-infection recovery to gain access to, entry upon, or service from County government buildings, operations, or services. | | |

SECTION FIVE: Private employer COVID-19 vaccination mandates prohibited.

| (A) A private employer within Co | ounty may not impose a COVID-19 vaccination |
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| mandate for any full-time, part-time, or cont | ract employee without providing individual |
| exemptions that allow an employee to opt out of su | ch requirement on the basis of medical reasons, |
| including, but not limited to, pregnancy or anticip | pated pregnancy; religious reasons; COVID-19 |

SECTION NINE: Penalties.

Violations of this Ordinance shall be punishable as provided by law for the violation of County ordinances. In addition, violation of this Ordinance shall give rise to a private right of action for civil suit in a court of competent jurisdiction.

SECTION TEN: Severability

If any phrase or portion of the Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion.
